Overview

This four-week Stewardship program uses a tree to visualize how the body of Christ, the church works together to share the goods new of Jesus Christ. Using leaves to write words or sentences to share how each one of us experiences God's grace and love through each other and the church. Such as a seed that is planted in fertile soil will grow abundantly so will the church if each member shares the resources they have been given. Each week is focused on a specific question which the worship service will reflect. There is a suggested scripture reading for each week along with a message to share with the congregation.

A letter with an estimate of giving card is recommended to be sent out the Monday after the second Sunday.

Week One

Theme – We all have a place Scripture – 1 Corinthians 12:12-31 Question – Where do you see God or the face of Christ in the ministry of this congregation?

Introduce the Stewardship Program and Tree

Trunk of the tree is The Church or the Body of Christ, God's people Branches are what God is calling us to do Outreach/Mission Programs/Ministries Social Events Leaves are what we can each do to transform lives

What will be needed

Leaves* Pencils Volunteer to help folks hang the leaves on the tree Someone to explain the program *Use colored construction paper. Ask someone with a Cricket machine and access to a leave template to cut out enough leaves for each person attending worship each week. Using a hole punch, punch a hole in the leaf and use string so the leave can be hung on the tree. Below is a picture of a tree with the leaves at the end of the four weeks.



Message for bulletin

This year's Stewardship focus is entitled "The Giving Tree". For the next four weeks we will reflect how each of us at (insert your church name) are faithfully a part of and participate in the Giving Tree.

This week's focus is how each of us makes up the church, Apostle Paul's illustration, the Body of Christ. The focus for Paul and for us, as the church, is that Christ is center and foundational to the very life and purpose of the church. As we look at the tree imagine the trunk as the Body of Christ or the church – all of us forming the church, the branches representing what God is calling us to do as a community, and the leaves we will add represent what we can do individually to transform people's lives. The leaves are the fruit of our labor through the many ways we can be involved with the church. We can give financially, we can give of our time, and we can pray. All these things are important. Together, with God, we can make a difference in this church, in our community and the world.

At this time of year, the church council and stewardship ministry team begin to design the budget. Looking back, they can estimate what expenses will be and what programs have made an impact (transformed people's lives). It is important for the church council and stewardship committee to understand pledges so they can realistically form the budget. As we all personally know how budgets work in our home lives, life happens. There is always something that is going to happen to shake up the well planned out budget.

It would be a tremendous help to receive pledge cards from everyone who is able so a realistic budget can be developed. No one holds you to the pledge as I said, life happens, we understand.

Together our giving can transform people's lives. Remember a \$5 per week individual increase does not sound like a lot, however, if every giving unit gave this amount, it would be approximately insert (\$/)week or (insert\$)/year!

We ask that over the next four weeks to listen and open your hearts to the Stewardship moments. <u>On Pledge Sunday we will have a brunch after worship hosted by the Stewardship committee</u>. This brunch will symbolize our strength together and our time to celebrate all we have in our lives.

Over the next four weeks we will be adding leaves to the tree. During worship services you will be asked a question, which will also be in the bulletin. You will write or draw however you wish to respond on the leaves which will be handed out with the bulletins. During the service you will be asked to hang the leaf on the tree. You do not need to include your name.

Today's question is – Where do you see God or the face of Christ in the ministry of this congregation?

Here are the ways I see the face of Christ in the ministry of this congregation – <u>handing</u> <u>our food when the foot pantry was closed – offering space for AA and Alnon to use – responding</u> <u>to UCC's mission- offering gifts at Christmas with the gift tags – writing to the two children the</u> <u>church sponsor's – these are just a few ways I see the face of Christ in this space.</u>

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Week Two

Theme – Love Transforms Scripture – Luke 19:1-10 Question – What is one way (or more) you have helped to transform someone's life?

During fellowship time or in the narthex for folks to look at before or after service, display the many ways your congregation has made an impact in the community transforming lives. This may include hosting AA meetings, social events, choirs, food pantry, UCC 5 for 5 offerings, OCWM etc.

What will be needed

Leaves Pencils Presentation listing all of the ways the congregation transforms people's lives Someone to write and present a short message Volunteer to help folks hang the leaves on the tree

Message for bulletin

Today's Stewardship theme, "Love Transforms", reminds us of the many times a simple act of kindness, the going-out-of-the-way gesture of welcome, hospitality, and acceptance, turns the hurting, lonely heart, into a joyfully filled soul.

Such gestures don't require much from us, just a bit of time and energy that, when we honestly reflect, is the very gift God has given us to share abundantly.

Christ-centered love is not something we share when someone asks for it, but is a movement into the lives of others. Jesus goes into the home of Zacchaeus, the space where he lives, to share that transformational love of acceptance. But this moving towards the one in need of Christ's love, is common throughout the Gospels.

The Samaritan crosses the road to the one wounded, to share transformational love of healing.

Jesus is at the well with the woman, to share the transformational love of wholeness.

This week, we are asked to reflect on how each of us individually, and as a congregation, have been called into someone's life to offer the transformational love of Christ. How have we noticed the need for hope, compassion, healing, forgiveness and acceptance; and, like Jesus, (since being like Jesus is being Christ-like), entered the life of one in need?

The church's, the body of Christ, primary work is to transform lives in Christ's love. As we graciously offer not only our lives, but our gifts, to the church's ministry, the lives of many can, and will, be transformed in Christ's love.

First, I would like to read a few responses from last week's question - Where do you see the face of Christ in the ministry of this congregation?

I realize I have left off events this church has hosted and/or organized for the community. (Insert your churches name) has transformed people's lives in their outreach and hospitality.

By living out our faith we leave behind a legacy. Even though we are small in numbers we can make an impact. It will take the congregation to combine their resources to make the largest impact. Remember a small weekly or monthly increase in your pledge adds up quickly. Together, as the body of Christ, we can do God's work.

Week Three

Theme – Starting again for the first time Scripture – Haggai 2:1-9 Question – How will you put your faith into action?

Discuss the budget, what is needed to transform lives

Simple examples of how the budge would be impacted if each unit giving unit gave X more a week

List the many ways folks can give of their time and talent

Sunday or adult studies Help with social or fundraising events Participate in outreach/mission work Hospitality Lay reader Choir Etc.

Have a presentation during fellowship time or in the narthex for folks to see the many ways they can volunteer

Message for bulletin

Starting Again for the First Time seems to be a bit of a head scratcher. The intent is to have us take a brief pause to assess not only where we have been, which is our legacy, but to look at the potential and opportunities that lie ahead.

Our legacy is the foundation of who the church is. Through the past and present ministries and programs, the church celebrates the grace of God and the ministry of Jesus Christ. There is much that has made the congregation a living presence of God's love in the world.

Yet, each day and moment, the church is called to be a part of the renewal of God's presence, to pursue the new vision in an ever-changing world. Renewal reflects our being the people of the Resurrection, that we are a people of legacy, as well as a future.

Our Stewardship is a response not only to our legacy, but to the vision and hope of the future of the church. It is the living belief that we have so much more to offer to God, and the world, in the name of Jesus Christ.

Read two or three from last week – last week's question was What is one way (or more) you have helped to transform someone's life?

The past 2 weeks you have answered questions on how this church and you as an individual have been the fruit of the tree. When we combine the talents, God has given each of us we can be powerful. Powerful, not in the way of getting our way or forcing something onto others, but in a way to communicate to the wider community the love of Jesus Christ.

Through our resources, the budget, programs are developed to spread the good news of the Risen Christ and staff are available to lead the congregation into the programs to reach people. God is calling each and every one of us to do what we can so others can see the face of Christ.

There are many ways you can share your talents with this congregation and the community around us. Here are just a few examples:

Examples - Change to fit the volunteer opportunities at your church

Help with the nursery Teach Sunday School or an Adult Study Participate in fundraisers Usher Join a choir Host Coffee Hour Be a lay reader Visit a shut-in Organize an event Pray And of course, by giving financially

The truck of the tree is a symbol of the Body of Christ or the Church, all of us forming the church, the branches represent what God is calling us to do as a community, and representing what God is calling us to as a community are the leaves we are adding each week. The leaves are the fruit of our labor – how will you use your talent to show others the peace and grace of God.

Week Four

Theme – God creating a new us Scripture – Isaiah 65:17-25 Question – How has the generosity of others transformed your life?

Leaves Pencils Pledge cards Someone to write and present a short message Volunteer to help folks hang the leaves on the tree Volunteers to prepare and service a special breakfast or fellowship time

Message for bulletin

"In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth..." (Genesis 1:1) "I am about to do a new thing; not it springs forth, do you not perceive it?" (Isaiah 43:19)

The past three weeks we have been asked, challenged, even to reflect deeply on our faith journey as individuals and a faith community. We celebrated our ministries, outreach, the lives we have touched and who we are.
