In accordance with Article VI of the Constitution and Article II and III of the By-Laws of the Illinois Conference of the United Church of Christ, notice is hereby given that the 2016 Annual Meeting of the Conference will be held at the Embassy Suites in East Peoria Illinois June 17-18, 2016



The By-Laws, Article II provides:

- 1. Every local church which has standing in an Association of the Conference shall be entitled to representation in the Conference by **one voting lay delegate**, and in addition thereto, each such church shall be entitled to representation by **one voting youth delegate** (a person at least 14 years of age, but not older than 22.) A church of **800 or more members** shall have **one additional delegate and one additional youth delegate.**
- 2. All **ordained, commissioned and licensed ministers** who have standing or recognition in an Association of the Conference shall be **voting members**. The **members of the Conference Council** shall be voting members of the Conference during their term of office.

Blackmon was appointed as the Acting Executive Minister of UCC Justice and Witness Ministries in October, 2015. Rev. Blackmon also serves as Pastor of Christ the King UCC in Florissant, Missouri. She became nationally recognized as a prominent voice for social change when Michael Brown was shot in Ferguson, MO, just miles from her church. She immediately got involved in assisting and collaborating with the people in the community working for justice. She shares: "The conversation must begin with a determination to listen and a willingness to be changed."

A transformational strategy must be biblically grounded, faith driven and must come out of a process that invites and engages the Holy Spirit, and is driven by prayer, Bible study and scriptural discernment.

Join us in dialogue as we discern God's call to transformative life and vitality as we seek to be outward focused; as we lay our foundation on the Christ instead of the church; as we worship and live with purpose and mission; as we promote an attitude of generosity; as we seek to engage in prophetic ministry; as we focus on discipleship and faith formation; as we engage in ministry in the community; and as we gain and fulfill a vision of hope for the future.


