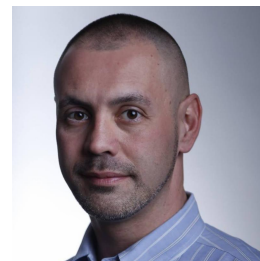

When Rev. Traci Blackmon addressed the Illinois Conference in March, she reminded us that not all feel called to take to the streets but that members of our congregations can respond as they feel called to witness for justice and peace.

Do you have members of your congregations who are called to write grants? There are various sources of funds available for example, the American Rescue Plan that can be used for a variety of community-based projects and programs that can promote community, justice, and peace. Grants can be made for projects of individual congregations, for the Chicago Metropolitan Association (CMA), and for the Illinois Conference. Grant Accountability and Transparency Act (GATA) Qualification applications are essential for the state of Illinois grants, so expertise with these applications is especially useful.
