**Workshop A: Creating Community in Your Congregation** 

Presenters: Robert Buckner, Rev. Patrick Daymond

Explore ways to create community through uncovering culture and reclaiming lost value from the pews. We will focus on the foundational life of the congregation, while giving practical tools and strategies for bringing clarity to the mission and vision of the church. By creating community, you will create an environment where the church can resemble the best of the Acts 2 church, finding a place to be together and have things in common that can extend to the surrounding community.

Robert Buckner has served the youth, young adults, singles and pastoral care ministries at a number of incredible ministries including Covenant United Church of Christ. Rev. Dr. Patrick Daymond serves as Pastor of Covenant UCC in South Holland under the leadership of Rev. Dr. Ozzie E. Smith, Jr. He previously served as Pastor of Memorial Presbyterian Church in Roosevelt, New York.

# Workshop B: Ministering to Wisdom Folk Presenters: Dr. Sammie Dortch, Rev. Dr. Vertie Powers

Share in discussion about transformation in an increasingly off kilter society. Workshop was developed out of Off the Pews: Faith In Action, launched in 2014 by the CMA, where faith and secular communities with compatible missions collaborated to reduce violence and resulting trauma. As a justice seeking faith community, we believe the existence of systemic challenges in broader community, e.g. racism, poverty, under-treated mental and physical health, are at the core of violence. Although the ministry is intergenerational, "Wisdom People" are central to any success in this call to action. Needless to say, we do not believe that age and wisdom are mutually exclusive. An examined life with the willingness to make changes from learned experience is necessary for the development of wisdom.

Rev. Dr. Vertie Powers is Associate Conference Minister of the Illinois Conference. Dr. Sammie Dortch is the retired chair of a five-discipline department where she also taught Social Work. Her consultancy work involves organizational development and curricula design.

## Workshop C: Extravagant Welcome Is Just for Some. Creating Extraordinary Communities of Welcome

# Workshop F: Setting Captives Free: Use of End Money Bond Presenter: Dr. Christophe Ringer

Workshop presents the use of end money bond as a matter of economic injustice that our faith calls us to change. Participants will engage the way in which the practice of money disproportionately affects the least economically advantaged in black and brown communities. Participants will also develop their own voice in articulating their faith as it related to this violation of human rights.

Christopher Ringer is Assistant Professor of Theological Ethics and Society at Chicago Theological Seminary. He serves on the boards of A Just Harvest and Community Renewal Society.

# Workshop G: Church as Agent of Change – Intro to Community Organizing

## Presenters: Rev. Jason Coulter, Rev. Samuel Paul

Our churches are not ivory towers. They exist in communities that are challenged and need good schools, quality jobs, safe streets, access to health care and clean air and water. Learn how your congregation can get involved in community organizing and become an agent of change. Workshop provides an introduction to the tools and tactics of community organizing and helps you connect to organizations doing the on-the-ground work in the Chicagoland area.

Trained as a union organizer, Rev. Jason Coulter is pastor of Ravenswood UCC and active with Community Renewal Society and Arise Chicago. Rev. Samuel Paul is Associate Pastor of Greater Pleasant Green MB Church in Morgan Park and serves on the Community Renewal Society Board.

# Workshop H: Co-Sponsoring Refugee Families with RefugeeOne Presenter: Kim Snoddy

Since 1982, RefugeeOne has welcome refugees from every major world crisis in history including Cambodia, Rwanda, Servia, Iraq, Iran, Sudan and Syria. Learn how the United States resettlement

program works and what challenges it faces due to current administration policies. Find out ways your congregation can help RefugeeOne welcome newly arrived refugees and the efforts you can take to ensure the United States resettlement program remains strong.

Kim Snoddy helps refugees build new lives of safety, dignity, and self-reliance in the Chicagoland area. She serves as Manager of Co-Sponsorships and Housing at RefugeeOne, helping to secure housing for refugee families. She forms partnerships between RefugeeOne and other interested communities.

#### Workshop I: Mental Health and the Church

This workshop will be an introduction to common mental health needs of our churches, ways to support congregations and our communities, as well as provide additional resources for continued learning and referrals.
