Isaiah 6: 1-8 – A Vision of God in the Temple

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. John 13: 1-17 – Jesus Washes the Disciples' Feet

Now before the festival of the Passover, Jesus knew that his hour had come to depart from this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end. The devil had already put it into the heart of Judas son of Simon Iscariot to betray him. And during supper, Jesus,

knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he had come from God and was going to God, got up from the table, took off his outer robe, and tied a towel around himself. Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel that was tied around him. He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, "Lord, are you going to wash my feet?" Jesus answered, "You do not know now what I am doing, but later you will understand." Greeting Reverend Wood

Grace to you and peace from God, who is and who was and who is to come, and from Jesus Christ the faithful witness and the sovereign of creation. The Eastern Association of the Illinois Conference of the United Church of Christ greets you in the name of Jesus Christ, the head of the church.

Presentation Eric Myers

(addressing the association representative)

St. Paul's United Church of Christs, after carefully considering the call to ordained ministry of Matt Wolf, respectfully requests that the Eastern Association ordain Matt to the ministry of the church of Jesus Christ, consistent with scripture and with the traditions of the church universal, and according to the faith and order of the United Church of Christ.

(addressing the congregation)

The Eastern Association has reviewed the request of St. Paul's United Church of Christ. We have prayerfully examined Matt concerning his fitness for ministry in Christ's church. We are pleased on behalf of the United Church of Christ, to authorize the ordination of Matt into the Christian ministry.

(Addressing the ordinand)

Matt, servant of God we invite you to come forward as a sign of your consent to receive ordination into Christian ministry.

The United Church of Christ acknowledges as its sole head, Jesus Christ, Son of God and Savior. It acknowledges as kindred in Christ all who share in this confession. It looks to the word of God in the scriptures, and to the presence and power of the Holy Spirit, to prosper its creative and redemptive work in the world. It claims as its own the faith of the historic church expressed in the ancient creeds and reclaimed in the basic insights of the Protestant reformers. It affirms the responsibility of the church in each generation to make this faith its own in reality of worship, in honesty of thought and expression, and in purity of heart before God. In accordance with the teaching of our Lord and the practice prevailing among evangelical Christians, it recognized two sacraments: Baptism and Holy Communion.

The United Church of Christ recognizes that God calls the whole church and every member to participate in and extend the ministry of Jesus Christ by witnessing to the gospel in church and society. The United Church of Christ seeks to undergird the ministry of its members by nurturing faith, calling forth gifts, and equipping members for Christian service.

Ordination is the rite whereby the United Church of Christ through an association in cooperation with the person and a local church of the United Church of Christ, recognized and authorized that member whom God has called to ordained ministry, and sets that person apart by prayer and the laying on of hands. By this rite ordained ministerial standing is conferred and authorization is given to perform the duties and exercise the prerogatives of ordained ministry in the United Church of Christ.

Do you accept the faith and order of the United Church of Christ; and will you, as an ordained minister in this communion, ecumenically reach out toward all who are in Christ and show Christian love to people of other faiths and people of no faith?

People of God, you have heard the promises Matt has made. What is your will?

Association Members

By the grace of God, he is worthy! Let us ordain him. Come, Holy Spirit.

Rev. Wood

Will you support Matt in the ministry of Christ?

Association members

We will.

Laying on of Hands Rev. Wood

The laying on of hands is the symbolic act whereby the church in every age recognized God's call to ministry in the lives of faithful woman and men and asks the Holy Spirit to confer on them gifts for ordained ministry. In times when we are all able to gather in one physical space, all ordained clergy, as well as members of the ordinand's family would be invited to come forward to lay hands upon the ordinand while the congregation surrounds them. Today, in order to observe safe practices during the pandemic, we ask that Matt's family, Michele, Eliza, and Brandon Wolf, surround him to lay hands upon him, and that all gathered and on Zoom raise your hand, palm facing forward, in a symbolic act of laying on hands.

Let us pray.

Eternal God, in wisdom you govern all things, and from the beginning you have chosen faithful people to serve you in ministry, calling some apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip all your people for the work of the ministry and for building up the body of Christ. Now bless and sanctify by your Holy Spirit your servant Matt, whom we, in your name and in obedience to your will, by prayer and with the laying on of hands, ordain to the ministry of the church, committing to him the authority to preach your word, administer the sacraments, and exercise the responsibilities of pastor and teacher. Bestow on Matt the power of your Holy Spirit, confirming what we do. Let the same mind be in him that was also in Christ Jesus. Enable him to nourish your people in the faith of the gospel. Fill his speech with truth and his life with purity. Increase the faith of Matt in you, strengthen him in the day of trouble, prosper his words and works that your name may be glorified and your truth exalted; through Jesus Christ our Sovereign and Savior.
