UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST Position Title: Director of Youth Ministry-PT (updated 2024)

Purpose: The Director of Youth Ministries works with volunteers, parents, and other staff to ensure a stimulating, caring, nurturing environment where the youth of the church are educated about God, scripture, and community through an engaging youth group and additional age-appropriate events. Our Open and Affirming statement affirms that we love our neighbor as we love ourselves, and our neighbors include all races, ethnicities, physical and mental abilities, family configurations, sexual orientations, gender identities, and economic conditions.

Description: The part-time Youth Ministry Director is supervised directly by the Senior Pastor. The Youth Ministry Director is supported by the Christian Education Committee. Annual performance reviews will be conducted by the Staff Relations Committee in cooperation with the Senior Pastor.

## Responsibilities:

1. Evaluate and select age and content-appropriate curriculum for youth group (6 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ grade through High School).
2. Lead once-weekly youth group activities.
3. Plan regular activities and programs for the spiritual and social development of youth in cooperation with the Christian Education Committee. This would include, but not be limited to, service projects and mission projects.
4. Attend staff meetings and monthly committee meetings.
5. Work with our marketing company to contribute to current social media sites and create social media interaction for our youth.
6. In collaboration with the Senior Minister, provide leadership and guidance for our confirmation program.

Qualifications: The Director of Youth Ministries possesses a deep faith in Jesus Christ and has a heart and vision for the spiritual growth and nurture of youth. The person has working knowledge of the bible and is familiar with the emotional and developmental needs of youth. This position allows one to bring their own ideas and creativity to the job. This person is comfortable and successful working independently with minimal day-to-day supervision.
